



NOTICE OF ELECTION

I, Linda Stover, Clerk of Bernalillo County, by virtue of the authority vested in me, do hereby issue the notice of election, Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 1-11-2 and §1-11-3:

That a Regular Local Election is called to be held throughout the County of Bernalillo and in each precinct thereof on Tuesday, November 2, 2021; and

That a Regular Local Election shall be a nonpartisan election, and the names of all candidates shall be listed on the ballot with no party or slate designation; and

That all municipalities that have opted to elect their officers on the Regular Local Election ballot, where applicable, shall conduct the runoff election pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 1-22-16, either as a top-two runoff election or as a ranked-choice runoff election; and

That the City of Albuquerque shall conduct a top-two runoff election following the Regular Local Election, should one be necessary. If a top-two runoff election is necessary, it will be held on Tuesday, December 7, 2021; and;

That a Regular Local Election shall be held to elect qualified persons to membership on a local governing body and, where applicable, to elect municipal officers for the following offices:

THE GROSS RECEIPTS TAX REVENUE BONDS FOR MULTI-USE PUBLIC STADIUM
Shall the City of Albuquerque acquire property for, and to design, develop, erect, construct and otherwise improve a public stadium for multiple uses, including, but not limited to, professional soccer events to be financed by up to \$50,000,000 of its gross receipts tax revenue bonds?

ALBUQUERQUE MUNICIPAL SCHOOL DISTRICT GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND QUESTION

Shall the Albuquerque Municipal School District No. 12 be authorized to issue up to \$200,000,000 of general obligation bonds for the purpose of (1) erecting, remodeling, making additions to and furnishing school buildings, (2) purchasing or improving school grounds, (3) purchasing computer software and hardware for student use in public schools, (4) providing matching funds for capital outlay projects funded pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act, or (5) any combination of these purposes?

ALBUQUERQUE MUNICIPAL SCHOOL DISTRICT PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDINGS ACT TAX QUESTION

Shall the Albuquerque Municipal School District No. 12 impose a property tax levy of \$3.838 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value of residential property and \$4.344 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value of non-residential property allocated to the Albuquerque Municipal School District No. 12 for the property tax years 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025, 2026 and 2027 for the purposes of A. erecting, remodeling, making additions to, providing equipment for or furnishing public school buildings; B. payments made pursuant to a financing agreement entered into by a school district or a charter school for the leasing of a building or other real property with an option to purchase for a price that is reduced according to payments made; C. purchasing or improving public school grounds; D. purchasing activity vehicles for transporting students to and from extracurricular school activities; provided that this authorization for expenditure does not apply to school districts with a student MEM greater than sixty thousand; E. administering the projects undertaken pursuant to Subsections A and C of this section, including expenditures for facility maintenance software, project management software, project oversight and district personnel specifically related to administration of projects funded by the Public School Buildings Act; provided that expenditures pursuant to this subsection shall not exceed five percent of the total project costs; and F. purchasing and installing education technology improvements, excluding salary expenses of school district employees, but including tools used in the educational process that constitute learning and administrative resources, and which may also include: (1) satellite, copper and fiber-optic transmission; computer and network connection devices; digital communication equipment, including voice, video and data equipment; servers; switches; portable media devices, such as discs and drives to contain data for electronic storage and playback; and purchase or lease of software licenses or other technologies and services, maintenance, equipment and computer infrastructure information, techniques and tools used to implement technology in schools and related facilities; and (2) improvements, alterations and modifications to, or expansions of, existing buildings or tangible personal property necessary or advisable to house or otherwise accommodate any of the tools listed in this subsection?

MORIARTY-EDGEWOOD SCHOOL DISTRICT GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND QUESTION

Shall the Moriarty-Edgewood School District No. 8 be authorized to issue up to \$11,000,000 of general obligation bonds for the purpose of (1) erecting, remodeling, making additions to and furnishing school buildings, (2) purchasing or improving school grounds, (3) purchasing computer software and hardware for student use in public schools, (4) providing matching funds for capital outlay projects funded pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act or (5) any combination of these purposes?

PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TAX QUESTION

Shall the Moriarty-Edgewood School District No. 8 be authorized to continue to impose a property tax of \$2.00 per each \$1,000.00 of net taxable value of property allocated to the Moriarty-Edgewood School District No. 8 for the property tax years 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025 and 2026 for capital improvements in the District and Estancia Valley Classical Academy including payments made with respect to lease purchase arrangements as defined in the Education Technology Equipment Act or the Public School Lease Purchase Act, but excluding any other debt service expenses for: (1) erecting, remodeling, making additions to, providing equipment for or furnishing public school buildings, including pre-kindergarten classroom facilities; (2) purchasing or improving public school or pre-kindergarten grounds; (3) maintenance of public school buildings, including public school or pre-kindergarten grounds, including the purchasing or repairing of maintenance equipment and participating in the facility information management system as required by the Public School Capital Outlay Act and including payments under contracts with regional education cooperatives for maintenance support services and expenditures for technical training and certification for maintenance and facilities management personnel, but excluding salary expenses of school district employees; (4) purchasing activity vehicles for transporting students to extracurricular school activities; (5) purchasing computer software and hardware for student use in public school classrooms; and (6) purchasing and installing education technology improvements, excluding salary expenses of school district employees but including tools used in educational process that constitute learning and administrative resources?

FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TAX
AGAINST THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS TAX

Those voters who requested an absentee ballot for the 2021 Regular Local Election will be mailed a ballot on Tuesday, October 5, 2021. Voters may submit an absentee ballot application until Thursday, October 28, 2021. Upon receiving and completing the ballot, the voter shall mail the ballot with the prepaid return envelope to the Bernalillo County Clerk's Office, which will be notated on the return envelope.

Bernalillo County voters may also deliver the absentee ballot in person to the Bernalillo County Clerk's Office located at Alvarado Square, 415 Silver Ave. SW, Albuquerque, NM 87102; from October 5, 2021 – November 1, 2021, Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and on Election Day, November 2, 2021 from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. In addition, voters may deliver a ballot in person to the Clerk's Office Annex located at 1500 Lomas Blvd. NW, Suite A, Albuquerque, NM 87104, October 5 – October 15, Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

During Early Voting and Election Day, a voter may deliver an absentee ballot to any Voting Convenience Center listed below. Ballots will be accepted until 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 2, 2021.
